- Read Ephesians 6:1-9. What kind of relationships are highlighted in this passage?
- What promise is given to those who honor their parents? In your current season of life, what does it look like for you to honor your parents? Be specific.
- What does it look like to be Gospel-centered in parenting? Refer to the following:
 - 1. Gospel centered parents have put their faith in Jesus Christ for their salvation. (Titus 2:11-15)
 - 2. Gospel centered parents are actively pursuing Christ. (Mark 8:34-35)
 - 3. Gospel centered parents are prioritizing their marriage over their role as parents. (Ephesians 5:31-33)
 - 4. Gospel centered parents are regularly attending church and engaged in serving. (1 Peter 5:10)
 - 5. Gospel centered parents are modeling intentional community with other believers. (Hebrews 10:24-25)
 - 6. Gospel centered parents are pointing their children to the application of God's Word. (Deuteronomy 6:7)
 - 7. Gospel centered parents are regularly praying for and with their children. (Philippians 4:6-7)
 - 8. Gospel centered parents are proactively engaging the faith of each child. (Proverbs 22:6)
 - 9. Gospel centered parents are training their children through grace-centered discipline. (Ephesians 6:4)
 - 10. Gospel centered parents are casting vision for God's Kingdom. (Matthew 6:33)
